

Classroom Happenings...

Wow! What an exciting and busy month September was! The Kindergarten students have been busy learning the routines both inside and outside the classroom. For the most part, the Kindergarteners are adjusting well to our structured and nonstructured activities!

This month the class has managed to study two letters. We have focused on the letters P and U. We are using the Animated Literacy program. This program is also used some in grade one. During the letter study, students learn the name of the letter and the sound. Each letter also has a character and a story to go with it. Feel free to ask your child about Polly Panda, or Uncle Upton! When a letter is studied,

the class also does a variety of activities with that letter (printing it, finding it, a craft, actions, etc). Practicing this at home will increase your child's success with learning the letters and sounds. For example, ask questions like "What is the name of this letter? What sound does it make?" When reading with your child, have them look for those letters in a sentence.

Every morning the kindergarten students have been practicing printing their names, Students are encouraged to print their name with an upper case for the first letter and lower case for the remainder of their name. This is a skill we will continue to practice until students have mastered ir

In Numeracy, the kindergartens have focused on numbers 0 and 1. Students practice writing this number, making the number and identifying the number. We will continue to study a number a week for the upcoming months. The students will also be studying about patterns. We will be focusing on simple AB colored patterns. They will continue to work on creating and identifying patterns.



Thank you to the parents that joined us for the Terry Fox Run. And way to go Kindergarten for walking so far!!

Math



Social Studies


Students have been exploring what a community is and discussing the communities they are a part of.


Language Arts, Science and Social Studies


In grade 2 social studies this month, the students have been learning all about Meteghan. They have discovered the geographical location, what life was like in the early days, and things you can do/ explore there today!

In language arts we have started our Daily 5 routine which includes spelling, handwriting, journal writing, reading, and technology. The students have been working towards shorter transitions between centres, and focusing on their tasks. They are showing enthusiasm towards learning new spelling words every week.

We also started a read aloud unit using the novel "George's Marvelous Medicine" by Roald Dahl. Every day, students completed a journal entry about something we have read in the book. Everyone is enjoyed the book, and wrote good journal entries. In October we will begin our first novel study, "Bunnicula".

Grade 4 Math Update

In math this month, the grade 4's have been working on the "Place" Value" unit. This unit covers place value of numbers up to 6-digits. standard form, expanded form, written form, picture form, decimal place value, and rounding. Most days students participate in math centers. These centers include: Math with Teacher, Math on My Own, Math Games, and Math on Technology. Students are responding well to this model of math class, and are enjoying the ability to practice their math skills and strategies in different ways. Our next math unit will be Addition and Subtraction.

Music


We started recorders this month and have focused on the notes B, A, and G. We may have a Halloween style song prepared by the end of next month that we can present to you!

4 Core

This month, during our language arts periods, we have been focusing on completing our autobiographies. The grade 7's had to paragraph plan, write with flow, and do a paper edit. They were also able to show their creativity by adding personal

elements to their project! They are turning out amazing! We also worked on the elements that make a sentence complete, and continued our Daily 5 introductions. During math we worked with expressions and replacing numbers with variables. This can be a difficult concept to master, and so a lot of emphasis will be put on building confidence with this skill. Our science lessons have us exploring human impacts on ecosystems by completing a research project on the intended and unintended consequence we have on our planet. During social, we finished up Chapter I where we learned about three Indigenous groups and how their societies were structured. Next, we are moving onto European Exploration and how it helped shape Canada today.

Flag Football

Over the last few weeks, the students have been very committed to building their skills and understanding of flag football. They are showing a lot of growth and sportsmanship and should be very proud of themselves. Mrs. Wild's Room: Grades 3 & 6



Welcome back!

This year, the Grade 3 class comes down to my room for Math and Social Studies during the first three blocks of the day. The Grade 6 class is in my room for Science and Social during blocks 4 and 5.

Grade 3 Math & Social

The Grade 3 class has Math first thing in the morning. We are starting off the year by learning numbers to 1000. Eventually, the Grade 3s will be learning numbers up to 100000!

In Social. we have started by developing some mapping skills. They have been practising using directions (north, south, east. west), and have been looking at maps of the world, Canada, and Alberta in order to discuss terms such as hemisphere. longitude, latitude, equator, and prime meridian.

Grade 6 Science & Social

To start the year, we are completing the Matter unit in Science. In this unit, students learned all about the Particle Model of Matter, states of matter, and phase changes. They have also been learning about the expansion and contraction of matter in its different states, how water behaves when it changes to ice, and how ice acts as an insulator for bodies of water in the winter time. Next month, we will begin our first Social Studies unit.
